Agenda:

Arrival Sunday: Registration all day in the Rafters Conference Room. Meet and greet, set up Auction, Show & Tell display and rainforest wood sales. Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant

Day 1 Monday: Offical welcome and presentation of the program. Morning tea before a visit to the Rainforest Skywalk, lunch at the cedar Creek Winery. Visit an Arboretum with numerous labelled native trees. Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant.

Day 2 Tuesday: Bus Tour to Springbrook National Park, stopping off at the Purling Brook Falls, the Best of All Lockouts, see the 2000 year old Antarctic Beech trees, visit the Fudge Shop, Apple Tree Park for lunch (picnic & toilet facilities) and return via Canungra. Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant.

Day 3 Wednesday: Visit to the Tamborine Mountain Heritage Centre with a "Early Timber Getting History" presentation by Allan Rosser (Historian of the mountain). A Guided Tour of the Tamborine National Park. The free afternoon can be spent at the nearby "Gallery Walk" (70 specialty shops) where you can buy lunch. Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant.

Day 4 Thursday: AGM and Auction at Thunderbird Park "Rafters" Conference Room. Guest speaker Tony Groom (National Parks of the World) Morning Tea, Lunch and Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant.

Day 5 Friday: Guided Tour of Mt.Tamborine Botanical Gardens (picnic & toilet facilities), morning tea and lunch in the gardens. Free afternoon. Evening meal in the Rainforest restaurant.

Conference Concludes: Check-out & departures Saturday morning

Post Conference Tour:

Day 6 Saturday: Personal vehicles travel via the towns of Beaudesert and Boonah to Queen Mary Falls and a guided tour of a private 300 acre pristene rainforest with huge Rosewoods among the many species. This is a 2 hour drive to The Falls (café, picnic & toilet facilities). Stay overnight in Boonah, or in Warwick if you are heading south. Motel reservations would need to be made in advance.

- Distilleries, Wineries & Breweries
- Rainforest walks & Waterfalls
- Cedar Creek Estate Glow Worm Tours
- Watch the Hang Gliding at the lookout over the Canungra Valley

Rosewood – Dysoxylum fraserianum

Scentless Rosewood - Synoum muelleri

Silky Beech - Citronella moorei

Silky Oak - Grevillea robusta

Silver Ash - Flindersia schottiana

Tallowwood - Eucalyptus microcorys

White Beech – *Gmelina leichhardtii*

White Cedar - Melia azedarach

Yellowwood - Flindersia xanthoxyla
